Liverpool

Liverpool is a compact city. The conference venue, the majority of hotels and most tourist attractions are walkable from the waterfront and Liverpool Lime St Station. The sun always shines in Liverpool. In the unlikely event of rain (and for those with difficulty walking or map reading) taxis (hail on street and Uber rides) are always available in the city centre.

How to Get to Liverpool: BY AIR

(i) Liverpool

John Lennon airport is approximately 9 miles from the city centre. Taxis cost £20-25. Bus and rail connections are available:

(ii) Manchester

In most respects Manchester is an inferior city to Liverpool. However, it has an excellent large airport. There are direct rail and bus connections to Liverpool. Train tickets can be purchased on the day at very reasonable price.

(iii) London

London has 6 airports all with excellent public transport connections. London Heathrow airport has a rapid rail link to London Paddington railway station. The best method of onwards travel to Liverpool is by train (see below).

How to Get to Liverpool: BY TRAIN

Maximise your *tågskryt**! Liverpool has an excellent rail connection to London (direct trains 2 hours) and onwards to continental Europe via the Eurostar. Long distance rail travel in the UK can be very good value **if booked in advance**. The cheapest tickets are usually associated with a specific train time; travelling on another train can incur additional cost. Booking on the day is not recommended as this can be very expensive.
